

## FAMILY LESSONS - Join others learning about the shore

Lesson	Description
<b>DURATION: 1h 30m</b>	<b>Family ticket (up to 5 people) - £20 / Adult single - £9 / Child single - £6</b>
Crabbing Conservation	Go crabbing in deep and shallow rockpools for crabs to check and record their species, size, sex and health status. This Citizen Science lesson helps you learn more about intertidal crabs and how we need to look after them on our shores.
Eco Seashore Mobile Making	Combine natural materials, found man-made objects and hand tools to create an environmentally conscious mobile to take away with you. Learn what you should and should not take from the beach and why.
Fossil Hunting	Join a beach teacher searching and identifying creatures of the past on our rocky shores. Learn what they looked like and what type of creature they were and how they are connected and evolved to the marine creatures of today.
Marine Life Rescue	Ever come across a stranded or injured marine animal on the beach, dead or alive? Know what to do or who to call? This workshop gives you the information you need and includes starfish welfare and crab friendly handling techniques.
Reef Gullying	Explore the surge gullies created by tides and time Discover and learn more about our honeycomb worm reef habitats and the marine creatures that call them home. This is a wet and dry activity with wading (kids waist deep - no swimming)
Reef School	South Wales is lucky to have a unique habitat made entirely by worms. The Honeycomb worm reefs. These delicate living reefs are exposed when the tide recedes for us to explore and discover. Includes underwater viewing and possible wading (weather dependent).
Rock School	Learn about seashore rocks and sand. What are they? Where do they come from and what's the law? A lesson of discovery and experimentation.
Rockpool School	Learn how to Rockpool the correct wildlife friendly way including what equipment you should take, how to search, observe, catch and handle intertidal marine wildlife you find. Busting myths you may have learned in the past!
Seashell School	Collecting seashells is a wonderful activity at any age. Join us searching and identifying the seashells found on the shore. Learn what animals made them and how to tell them apart with top tips and identification clues.
Seaweed Foraging	Come and learn which seaweeds are edible, how to harvest them correctly and sustainably, the law and how to cook them on the shore.
Strandline School	Discover this habitat learning to identify and spot species remains, eggcases and clues to life in our oceans left behind by the tides, plus learn the importance driftwood and taking part in a 5 minute bad wood removal session to help the environment.
Tidepool Snorkelling	Join Emma, a qualified BSAC snorkel instructor and PADI open water diver, snorkelling the gullies and deeper rockpools of the shore. This lesson allows exploration of the underwater world without rough seas or currents.
Wild Beach Jewellery Making	Use natural beach materials, or get creative with beach litter, to make your own pieces of jewellery using what you find, design tips and hand tools.
